ne showcase is proud to feature John Whitney, Sr. as the synote speaker. Mr. Whitney's innovations and inventions of any cinematic techniques are used in motion picture becial effects as well as film and television titles and edits. The principles of his slit-scan motion control procses were used in the stargate-corridor sequence of 2001: SPACE ODYSSEY, the stunning time warp phenomena of TAR WARS, and the streak titles for SUPERMAN. He was varded a grant from the National Endowment of the Arts in 180 to complete a film which will be a teaching document in the subject of his book, Digital Harmony.

COVER

The cover design is a composite of John Whitney, Sr.'s *Harmonic Function* and Digital Production's *Cray Tower*. This digital scene-simulation, produced using a Cray IS/1000 computer and Ramteck 9400 display, is an example of the photographic reality in computer-based imagery currently being developed at Digital Productions.

BILL KOVACS - Representing Robert Abel & Associates, producers of television commercials for 7-Up, Levi Strauss and Braun Shaver Responsible for the main title design and some computer generated special effects in the Disney movie, TRON.

TED NAANES - Representing Evans and Sutherland, leader in the creation of real-time simulation and design.

PETER SORENSEN - Computer animation consultant and Art Director. Created the documentational article on <u>TRON</u> in <u>Cineffex</u> magazine
